As part of the Scottish Government's Scottish Attainment Challenge, Pupil Equity Funding is given to schools each year to help them support children's learning opportunities, particularly children impacted by poverty. The staff at Woodmuir Primary School are committed to ensuring equity for all children in our school and work hard to help all children achieve success. This year, our school was given £4,900, and this money has been used to employ a part-time Pupil Support Worker to support a range of universal and targeted learning opportunities.

This year, we purchasd a set of first novels to support our younger readers in the school


We have also planned targered Literacy inteventions to develop identified children's:
